## **1563 NEW SEASON LAMBS**

#### Sale at 9.15 am prompt Auctioneer: Richard Williams

A larger entry of lambs for the final sale of the year sold to a mixed trade. Lambs from 36 - 42 kilos sold well peaking at 116.8 pence. The primary reason for this was lack of export demand. Heavier sorts for the domestic trade proved much more difficult to sell. It appears the glut of New Zealand lamb on the market is forever depressing UK prices. The overall average of the lambs was 106.7 pence.

A similar entry of generally smaller ewes met another good trade. Strong ewes were in demand selling to £44. Due to the mixed quality of ewes forward the overall average was £28. First quality ewes sold from £32. Second quality sold from £20, small and plain ewes sold to this figure. A short entry of mainly plain rams averaged £27.20.

#### **42 REARING CALVES**

An entry of 42 rearing calves sold to an excellent trade with an average per head of all calves, excluding killers, £146. Bulls to a top price of £218 (twice) for Limousins with others of the same breed £210 and £180 (twice). Charolais bulls to £215 and £208. Simmental bulls £212 and £190, Belgian Blue £195 (twice). Aberdeen Angus £150 and Welsh Black £135. Belgian Blue Heifers to £190 and £160 with Limousin £180, £170 and £145. Charolais £170 and £160, Hereford cross £70 and Aberdeen Angus £70. #### **ARE YOU DEFICIENT?**

Are newborn calves slow to rise and suck? Is it difficult to fatten calves on your land? Is the consumption of grain/hay/silage high? Is it difficult to keep the cattle in peak condition? Is your lambing percentage low? Is there a significant difference between scanning percentage and lambs to market? Do your lambs stand still after weaning? Is it difficult to finish lambs without creep? Do you want your stock to grow healthier faster and cheaper? If you do then you might need to retain the balance of trace elements to your ground. #### PRE-MOVEMENT TB TESTING

Please note we will still be holding alternative Red and Green Exempt Markets. This means that fat cattle attending a Green Exempt Market do not need to be pre-movement tested.

This exemption is allowed as cattle are only able to go on to slaughter, back home, onto an approved holding and onto an exempt finishing unit. Dairy cows will still need to be tested.

Calves and Dairy Cows (in Gwilym Richards sale) must be kept separate from the finished cattle, so please make sure cattle are unloaded in the correct part of the market.
