A good entry of Show Cattle met a very good trade throughout. After many years of trying the Championship was won by Mr IR Pugh, with a 653 kilo steer which realized <u>270 pence</u> and was purchased by Neil Powell of HJ Edwards & Son of Pontrilas. Mr Pugh also had considerable success in other classes in the sale. The Reserve Champion was exhibited by Mesr GE Phillips & Son whose 605 kilo heifer sold for 250 pence to Doug Willis Ltd, Cwmbran. It was good to see some new faces around the ring and this certainly helped the overall show trade.

100 Commercial Cattle

A similar entry of Commercial Cattle sold to a much improved trade. All buyers were fit and the cold weather certainly seems to have stimulated demand. Better sorts sold from 160-170 pence. Many more cattle could readily have been sold.

IMPORTANT CATTLE -EAR TAGS

It is the vendors responsibility to ensure all ear tags are correct and readable. For cows needing only 1 tag please check everything on it can be read and it is not worn. If in any doubt, get a new plastic tag.

IF THE ANIMAL IS BINNED IT IS YOUR LOSS!

SHEEP EID

This only applies to Sheep born after 31st December 2009. For all Lambs born on or after 1st January 2010 we recommend:

- 1. A single electronic slaughter tag for those Lambs intended for slaughter within 12 months of age.
- 2. Full electronic identification for all Lambs intended for breeding i.e. ewe lambs.

ESCAPED LIVESTOCK PLAN

All farmers must secure the market gates to the gates of their trailers <u>each and every</u> time stock are loaded/unloaded. If this is not done you are liable for any damage caused by an escaped animal. Once you have finished loading/unloading these gates must be shut and secured. If an animal does escape please inform a member of staff immediately who will blow the 'Whistle'. This then warns the gate keeper to close the vehicle gates. Available staff will secure the market perimeter. Once secure, the escaped animal will need to be herded back into the market pens. (We may use quiet stock already penned to help catch the escaped animal).
