A number of plain thin sorts sold from 20 - 30 pence to reduce overall averages.

The poor trade at the end of last week resulted in a disappointing entry of lambs. The buyers were all complaining about New Zealand imports which is doing no good to the domestic trade. In spite of this a very good trade ensued well ahead of general expectations. Best sorts realized from 110-115 pence with 38 -43 kilos proving easiest sold. Heavier lambs peaked at £52. The overall average of the lambs was £45.

A similar entry of ewes sold to another good trade. Strong lean ewes sold to a top price of £50 and an overall average of £32. First quality ewes sold from £35. Second quality sold from £22, small and plain ewes sold to this figure. A short entry of mainly plain rams averaged £22.45.

# **55 REARING CALVES**

An entry of 55 rearing calves again sold to a good trade. Top price was £245 for a Charolais bull with others of the same breed £225, £220 (four times), etc. Limousin bulls to £185, £165, etc. Belgian Blue bulls £175, Aberdeen Angus £172, Hereford cross £155. Heifers to £182 for a Belgian Blue with others £155, £145, etc. Limousin heifers to  $\pounds 135$  and a smart Hereford heifer  $\pounds 142$ .

#### **ARE YOU DEFICIENT?**

Are newborn calves slow to rise and suck? Is it difficult to fatten calves on your land? Is the consumption of grain/hay/silage high? Is it difficult to keep the cattle in peak condition? Is your lambing percentage low? Is there a significant difference between scanning percentage and lambs to market? Do your lambs stand still after weaning? Is it difficult to finish lambs without creep? Do you want your stock to grow healthier faster and cheaper? If you do then you might need to retain the balance of trace elements to your ground. #### **PRE-MOVEMENT TB TESTING**

Please note we will still be holding alternative Red and Green Exempt Markets. This means that fat cattle attending a Green Exempt Market do not need to be pre-movement tested. This exemption is allowed as cattle are only able to go on to slaughter, back home, onto an approved holding and onto an exempt finishing unit. Dairy cows will still need to be tested. Calves and Dairy Cows (in Gwilym Richards sale) must be kept separate from the finished cattle, so please make sure
